The SOA Board has ensured ongoing SOA matters with quarterly business meetings, approval of a 2025 budget, and filing of needed financial reports. SOA had 58 paid members in 2024, a modest change from 59 members. The SOA website remained a SOA Board topic during 2024. SOA representatives (President and TC Chair) meet 2 – 3 times per year with representatives of ESC on international funds. SOA and ESC continue to hold international funds post the dissolving on the International Shintaido, France based nonprofit in June 2021.

I. Strategic Plan for 2024

A. Board members and board officers

Many transitions happened at the end of 2023 with the deaths of Brad Larson and HF Ito. Jim Sterling and David Palmer agreed to join the SOA Board for a term of

Sandra Bengtsson agreed to be acting Treasurer for 2024. Additional transitions are happening at the end of 2024. Nancy Billias, SOA Board member since 2012, has officially moved to Scotland and has become active with British Shintaido Management team. Nancy has served as membership chair for the last several years and announced she will be ending her service at the December SOA Board meeting. Laura Sheehan Barron has volunteered to finish the term of Nancy Billias until August 2025.

Michael Thompson, Co-founder of SOA announced he is stepping off the SOA Board on 31 December 2024. During his time on the SOA board, he has served in many capacities such as board president, membership secretary and treasurer. Michael will retain his title of Co-Founder and as such will be providing advice and guidance to the SOA organization. Many thanks to all who stepped forward during these transitions. Gratitude for multiple years of service to those who are leaving the SOA Board.

B. Social Media Platforms

All the social media platforms experienced growth in 2024. The SOA YouTube channel grew from 219 to 302 subscribers. Videos grew from 224 to 269 videos. C. Reaching new students and expanding Shintaido curriculum

The SOA strategic Plan for 2024 continued to offer teaching grants to reach new groups of people. Tomi Nagai-Rothe submitted a proposal and was selected to offer Shintaido to a group of Quakers in June 2024. Tomi presented to 23 participants over one week of daily practice. D. SOA NTC

Two new members joined the SOA NTC in 2024. Jennifer Peringer rejoined with new enthusiasm this year. Jennifer became Yondan Bojutsu at Dokan '24 in addition to being Shintaido Senior Instructor and Nidan in Shintaido Karate. Margaret Guay become Shintaido Senior Instructor at Dokan'24 and joined the SOA NTC in September 2024. Byron Russell also advanced to Shintaido Senior Instructor at Dokan'24. Shin Aoki became Godan in Shintaido Karate and General Instructor in Shintaido at Dokan'24. Robert Gaston became Yondan Bojutsu and David Franklin became Yondan Shintaido Karate. The SOA NTC refined the SOA examination process for examiners to focus on objective criteria. SOA together with ESC offered examinations prior to the start of Dokan '24 in August 2024. Heather Kuhn became Shintaido Graduate – Congratulations! With the enthusiasm from Dokan, the NTC is considering a plan for 2026.

II. New Projects

A. HF Ito Memorial Fund

Connie Borden traveled to France in January 2024 for HF Ito's Funeral. She represented SOA and ITEC at the service. A travel stipend was provided by SOA for Connie's travel. Per Ito's final wishes, SOA established a HF Ito Memorial Fund. \$2500 was donated by 23 February 2024. This fund will support the scattering of his cremated remains at places that were significant in Ito's practice and development of Shintaido. These include at Mt. Tam and Ocean Beach in California as well as Mt. Asama in Japan. Nicole Beauvois, with support from this fund, traveled to Japan to scatter Ito's sensei's ashes at Mt. Asama on 5 October 2024. B. Discussions with Global Taimyo Community(GTC)

The SOA Board held several meetings discussing a proposal for SOA to provide fiscal sponsorship to the Global Taimyo Community (GTC), an unincorporated organization. SOA previously provided this service – which is listed as part of the SOA mission to support fledgling groups – to Italy. At the December 2024 meeting, the SOA Board agreed to offer fiscal sponsorship to GTC.

This provides GTC the ability to have charitable contributions support its mission of expanding the teaching of Taimyo to the general public. GTC plans for one week of community practice of Taimyo in July 2025. See the GTC website for more details: <https://sites.google.com/view/globaltaimyo>.

III. International Gasshuku

The international event Dokan '24 with the theme Dokan – Circle of the Way was held 16 August to 20 August 2024. Charles Burns was the event manager and Ula Chambers was the Director of Instruction. A total of 54 attended Dokan '24 for six Keiko, morning Taimyo, evening gatherings, and two high level examination sessions.
